<u>Public Comment</u>: Deputy Clerk Linsley thanked the Board for their approving his attendance to the Clerk's training in Grand Rapids. The training was beneficial to his job duties as Deputy Clerk.

<u>Approval and Continuation of Certain Special Land Use (SLU) Permits.</u> The Planning Commission has recommended continuation and approval of the following SLUs:

#115.01 Mike Stringer, Service Rd. – Ivy Mineral Water

#123 Justin Pierce/Roy Harris, 839 S. Eden Rd. – Lansing Hit Club

Both SLU annual review fees have already been paid in full.

Supervisor's Report:

- 1.) To comply with State law, municipalities with master plans must review those plans at least every five years. That process is now underway in Vevay Township.
- 2.) The Township, in conjunction with Contractor Ron Wieferich, has begun installation of the emergency power generator that was approved at the June 2014 Board of Trustees meeting. For this reason, there will likely be a few Saturdays when the Township Hall will not be available for rental to residents. (Note: An initial 1/3 payment of \$7,200 has already been paid upfront to Mr. Wieferich as required by contract.)
- 3.) The Township received the Drain Commissioner's findings regarding Vevay's recreational fields. 35 square feet of plugged tile was responsible for much of the flooding in the fields. The Township has replaced hardware and completed many of the required repairs. The water is now flowing well and flooding has almost completely receded.
- 4.) The Township received a blight complaint at 1074 Service Road, Mason. Associated Government Services will be looking into this complaint.

5.) The two-day, on-site audit took place at the end of June. The auditor made only minor adjustments and his exit interviews with the Supervisor, Clerk, and Treasurer were positive. A "draft" of the Audited Financial Report will be presented to the Board at an upcoming meeting.

<u>Treasurer's Report: Summer Tax Collection.</u> Summer taxes have been mailed and the collection process is in full-swing. The Treasurer's office has started sending an informational sheet to help residents. Additionally, the Township has been accepting credit cards for tax payments. The response from residents has been favorable. "Point and Pay" charges a 3% user fee; the Township does not pay a fee. Residents paying by this method are fully informed of that fee before the fact.

<u>Clerk's Report: Elections Update.</u> The Election Commission has met and authorized the hire of this year's election inspectors. Election inspector training will be occurring the third and fourth weeks of July. So far, about 200 absentee ballots have been requested; approximately one third of the ballots requested have been returned.

<u>Authorization Request to Rent A Canopy for Election Days</u>. In the last election cycle, the Township provided residents with a tent to protect from harsh weather on the November Election Day. The Clerk's office requested the funds to provide a tent again for this year's elections. The price has not changed from the previous cost of \$245 per Election Day. Discussion was held regarding the cost and benefits of this purchase.

MOTION Howe, seconded Kean to authorize the rental of a sidewalk canopy for protection from harsh weather conditions at the August 5th Primary Election and the November 4th General Election at the cost of \$490.

<u>Proposed Amendments to Zoning Ordinance.</u> The Planning Commission has extensively reviewed our current Zoning Ordinance. The proper procedures of public notice, legal postings, and public hearings were followed as well as response to comments and concerns from our residents. Upon approval by the Board of Trustees, citizens will have 30 days to petition for the ordinance amendments to be repealed. More amendments are forthcoming.
