

services. A revision to the Fee Schedule language clarifying the applicable administrative fee will be presented to the Board at the June meeting.

Update on Fire Fees. Previously the Board discussed the charge for persons who had obtained a burning permit but still had a Mason Fire Department response. The new ordinance allows the Board to set fees by resolution. Supervisor Lazet distributed draft language that would waive charges for a Mason Fire Department response if the resident obtained a burning permit and was in full compliance with Vevay Township burning regulations as posted on the Township website. After discussion, Supervisor Lazet will draft a fire fee schedule resolution for adoption at the June Board of Trustees meeting.

Headlee Roll Back. Supervisor Lazet explained that the 1978 passage of the Headlee Amendment to the Michigan's Constitution requires a local unit of government to reduce its millage when its annual growth on existing property is greater than the rate of inflation. Assessor Mackenzie believes the rollback of Vevay Townships 2020 millage rate of 1 mill to .9952 mill for 2021 is due to the uncapping of sold properties. This represents lost revenue of approximately \$1,100 in the 2021-22 fiscal year.

T-1 Sewer District. Supervisor Lazet has been contacted by the City of Mason to renegotiate the 1995 District No. T-1 Agreement between the City of Mason, Alaiedon Township, and Vevay Township. This agreement extends the Mason sewer system from Howell Road through Alaiedon Township (Dart Container) and connecting into Legion Drive in Vevay Township. The Vevay Township/Legion Drive businesses paid, by special assessment, for a portion of the infrastructure. When the agreement for the project was drawn up, portions of the total sewage discharge in GPD (gallons per day) allotment was established at 80,000 GPD; 72,000 Vevay Township and 8,000 for Alaiedon. Dart Container has always used most of the capacity, with the Legion Drive district using only 5,000 to 7,000 GPD. Dart will have a new production process coming on-line this September, adding about 10,000 GPD to their discharge. In September of 2020, the allotted GPD was exceeded which, together with the new level of discharge coming up causing the request from the City of Mason for renegotiation of the agreement. Discussion followed on usage of Vevay Township's allocated 72,000 GPD, capacity of the sewer line, and protecting resources for Legion Drive. Supervisor Lazet will contact Attorney Revore and provide an update at the June Meeting.
